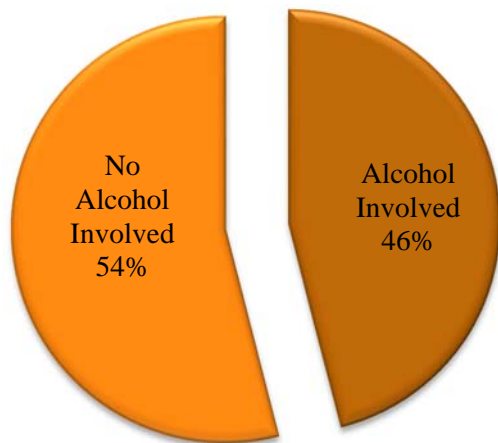

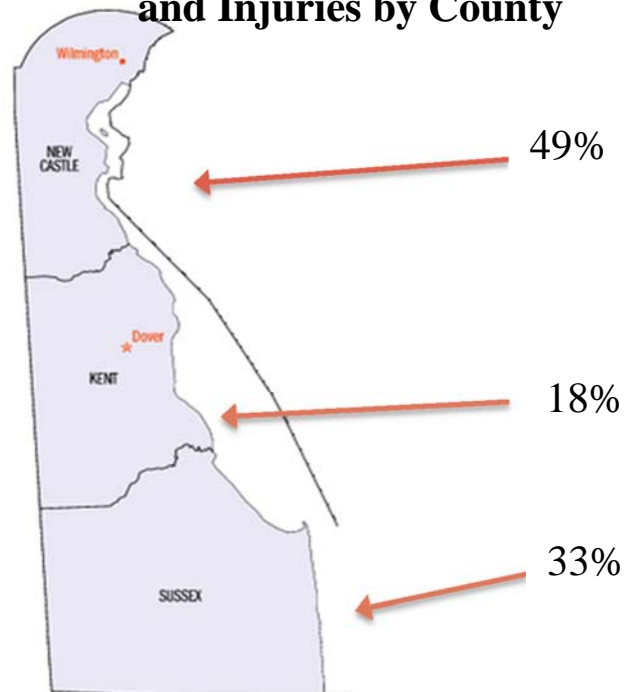
Across the state of Delaware, close to half of fatal car crashes in 2014 involved alcohol with most alcohol-related fatal crashes happening on Saturday night to Sunday morning

According to the Delaware Annual Traffic Statistical Report, in 2014 there were 22,986 traffic crashes in Delaware, in which less than 1% (n=111) were fatal. In these 111 fatal traffic crashes, 125 people died. For each person that was killed, there were 60 injured. Of all the fatal crashes, 46% involved alcohol and this has remained relatively stable over the past few years. Of the deaths and injuries (n=61) stemming from alcohol-related crashes, the majority occurred in New Castle County (49%). Of all fatal crashes that occurred on Saturday night starting at 10pm through 3am on Sunday morning, 92% were alcohol related.
